By Mr. Hawkins of Attleboro, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 494) of James K. Hawkins and others relative to a COVID-19 presumption for public employees. Covid-19 and Emergency Preparedness and Management.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to a COVID-19 presumption for public employees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1:- Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any employee of
2 the commonwealth or its political subdivisions who was required to work during the
3 Massachusetts state emergency related to COVID-19 declared on March 11, and required to
4 report to a work location outside of their home, who contract, have symptoms of or otherwise
5 becomes affected with the Coronavirus (COVID-19), that results in a period of hospitalization,
6 quarantine, or require self-quarantined measures as a result of being infected or coming into
7 contact with someone who is infected with this virus, shall have their medical condition or
8 incapacity to work presumed to be work related.

9 Section 2:- Any employee of the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions who was
10 required to work during the Massachusetts state emergency related to COVID-19 declared on
11 March 11, and required to report to a work location outside of their home and who dies as a

- 12 result of work-related COVID-19 shall be eligible for benefits under section 100 and 100A of
- 13 Chapter 32 of the General Laws.
- 14 Section 3:- This act shall take effect upon passage.
