1           *Ordered,* That the committee on Election Laws be authorized to sit during a recess of the  
2   General Court to make an investigation and study of Senate documents numbered 470 and 471  
3   and House documents numbered 769, 772, 773, 774, 778, 800 and 4070, relative to election  
4   laws.

5           Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study  
6   and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
7   recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives  
8   on or before December 31, 2022.
