Golden, Jr., relative to the retirement benefits of certain employees of the Department of Transitional Assistance and the Department of Housing and Community Development; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2684) of Russell E. Holmes for legislation to include certain employees of the Department of Youth Services in Group 4 of the contributory retirement system for public employees; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2713) of David Paul Linsky relative to the retirement rights of certain criminal prosecutors; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2725) of Joseph W. McGonagle, Jr., and others for legislation to include certain employees of the Commonwealth and certain Cambridge Health Alliance/Cambridge Hospital employees in Group 2 of the contributory retirement system for public employees; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2744) of James J. O'Day and Erika Uytterhoeven relative to the retirement benefits of certain employees of the Department of Children and Families; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2761) of Orlando Ramos, Peter Capano and Bud L.
