**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act regarding the disability pension for Elaina McAlister.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1.

2 (a) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Boston Retirement
3 Board shall increase the accidental disability retirement allowance payable to Elaina McAlister, a
4 retired emergency medical technician of the city of Boston who, as a result of injuries sustained
5 while in the performance of her duties on July 10, 2019, is totally and permanently incapacitated
6 from performing the essential duties of an emergency medical technician.

7 (b) The annual amount of pension payable to Elaina McAlister shall be equal to the
8 regular rate of compensation which would have been paid had she continued in service as an
9 emergency medical technician of the city of Boston at the grade held by her at the time of her
10 retirement until her death or reaching mandatory retirement age, whichever comes first. All
11 amounts paid under this act shall be non-taxable to the extent allowable under state and federal
12 law.

13 (c) Notwithstanding section 91A of chapter 32 of the General Laws or any other general
14 or special law to the contrary, Elaina McAlister's annual earnings, when added to her retirement
15 allowance, may annually earn up to one-half the amount of his retirement allowance without
16 refund penalty.

17 (d) Upon attaining the mandatory retirement age for an emergency medical technician of
18 the city of Boston, Elaina McAlister shall receive a pension pursuant to section 7 of said chapter
19 32, a yearly amount of pension equal to 80 percent of the annual rate of the compensation she
20 was receiving on the day before she reaches the mandatory retirement age for an emergency
21 medical technician in the city of Boston.

22 (e) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the benefits granted herein
23 shall be funded and administered by the Boston Retirement Board, consistent with and subject to
24 chapter 32 of the General Laws.

25 Section 2.

26 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Elaina McAlister shall be
27 entitled to receive indemnification for all hospital, medical and related expenses that have been
28 or may be incurred after the date of her retirement as a result of the injuries sustained by her
29 while in the performance of her duties on July 10, 2019, in accordance with sections 100 and
30 100B of chapter 41 of the General Laws.

31 Section 3.

32 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Boston Retirement Board
33 shall forthwith pay to said Elaina McAlister the amount credited to her as accumulated total

34 deductions in the annuity savings fund of the Boston Retirement Board as of the effective date of
35 this act.

36 Section 4.

37 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, if Elaina McAlister was
38 married upon the effective date of this act then, upon her death, if she is still married to the
39 spouse she was married to upon the effective date of this act then, should said spouse survive
40 her, the retirement board of the city of Boston shall pay to said spouse an annuity in the amount
41 of 75 percent of the amount of the pension which otherwise would have been payable to Elaina
42 McAlister until the spouse's death. The pension benefits provided for in this section and section
43 1 shall be subject to section 103 of chapter 32 of the General Laws.

44 Section 5.

45 In the event that both Elaina McAlister and her spouse to whom she was married on the
46 date of injury both predecease their children before their children reach the age of eighteen the
47 payments that would otherwise have been made to Elaina McAlister's spouse pursuant to section
48 4 had she predeceased him shall be payable, per stirpes, to each surviving children under the age
49 of 18; provided, however, that payments shall continue for the benefit of a surviving child 18
50 years or older who, on or before the date of death of Elaina McAlister and her spouse to whom
51 she was married on the date of injury, had been medically determined to be permanently
52 physically or mentally incapacitated from earning or for the benefit of a child under the age of 22
53 who is enrolled as a full-time student as determined by the criteria of the educational institution.

54 Section 6.

This act shall take effect as of January 31, 2022.
