1           *Ordered,* That the committee on Public Health be authorized to sit during a recess of the  
2 General Court to make an investigation and study of House documents numbered 2223, 2300,  
3 2301, 2339, 2345 and 2398, relative to medical oversight, testing, and other related matters.

4           Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study  
5 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
6 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives  
7 on or before December 31, 2022.
