An Act relative to healthy school lunches.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section  
2 15IIIII,

3 inserted by chapter 86 of the acts of 2001, the following section:-

4 Section 15JJJJJ.The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart March 21  
5 as

6 Massachusetts Child Nutrition Day and recommending that the day be observed in an  
7 appropriate manner by the people.

8 SECTION 2. Chapter 71 is hereby amended by inserting, after section x, the following  
9 new

10 section:-

11 Section 98. (a) The purpose of this section is to ensure that the students of the  
12 Commonwealth  
13 are appropriately nourished in order to support a healthier, livable and more equitable  
14 future  
15 for all.

16 (b) For the purposes of this section, the following words shall have the following  
17 meanings:-

18 (i) “entrée” is defined as the meat or meat alternate category within the USDA’s Federal  
19 Nutrition Standards

20 (ii) “Fiber-rich” is defined as a meal item that contains at least 20% of the  
21 minimum daily grams of fiber for youth ages 2-18 as determined by the  
22 National Institute of Health’s Daily Reference Intakes (DRI).

23 (iii) “Reimbursable meal” is any meal that meets the United States Department  
24 of Agriculture (USDA) National School Lunch Program nutritional  
25 requirements for federal reimbursement at the annual allotted rate of any of  
26 the following: (a) free lunch; (b) reduced-price lunch; or (c) paid lunch

27 (iv) “ultra-processed food” is defined as industrial formulations of food  
28 substances never or rarely used in kitchens (such as high-fructose corn syrup,

29 hydrogenated or interesterified oils, and hydrolysed proteins), or classes of  
30 additives designed to make the final product palatable, appealing, or  
31 preservable (such as flavours, flavour enhancers, colours, emulsifiers,  
32 emulsifying salts, sweeteners, thickeners, nitrates, nitrites, preservatives, and  
33 anti-foaming, bulking, carbonating, foaming, gelling and glazing agents)

34 (c) Any food service provider selling food to Massachusetts public schools for our  
35 children  
36 to consume shall ensure that at least 50% of the entrées sold and served for lunch  
37 within school hours in schools, school districts, or other entities over the course of each  
38 week are healthy foods containing whole grains, vegetables, fruits, legumes, and other  
39 fiber-rich proteins as part of a reimbursable meal offering within the federal National  
40 School Lunch Program.

41 (d) No food service provider may sell or serve in Massachusetts public schools, school  
42 districts, or other entities more than 20% of entrée items that are ultra-processed or  
43 have a nutritional composition that includes more than 30 milligrams of cholesterol or  
44 more than 5% of the entrées' total calories from saturated fat as part of a reimbursable  
45 meal offering within the federal National School Lunch

46 (e) Each food service provider selling food to Massachusetts public schools for school

47 children to consume, shall keep itemized nutrition data that is made publicly available  
48 on a monthly basis to demonstrate compliance with this statute.
