By Mr. Hawkins of Attleboro, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 613) of James K. Hawkins and others for legislation to cancel the administration of the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System or any other named statewide standardized assessment during the 2020-2021 school year. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act to cancel the administration of the MCAS for the 2020-2021 school year.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the commissioner
2 of elementary and secondary education shall submit to the United States Department of
3 Education a request that the Commonwealth’s statewide assessment, accountability and reporting
4 requirements under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act be waived for the 2020-2021
5 school year. The request shall be made pursuant to section 8401 of the Elementary and
6 Secondary Education Act and shall include a request to waive the assessment requirements in
7 section 1111(b)(2); the accountability and school identification requirements in sections
8 1111(c)(4) and 1111(d)(2)(C)-(D); and the report card provisions related to assessments and
9 accountability in section 1111(h).

10 Notwithstanding section 1I of chapter 69 of the General Laws or any other general or
11 special law to the contrary, upon approval of the request referred to in the first paragraph of this
12 section, the requirement for a comprehensive diagnostic assessment of individual students under

13 said section 1I of said chapter 69 is waived for the 2020-2021 school year in order to address
14 disruptions caused by the outbreak of the 2019 novel coronavirus, also known as COVID-19, and
15 the department of elementary and secondary education shall not require students to take the
16 Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System or any other named statewide standardized
17 assessment during the 2020-2021 school year.
