An Act relative to non-public school student access to the MCAS exam.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the department  
2 of elementary and secondary education shall issue a report on the feasibility and costs associated  
3 with non-public school students and home schooled students in grade 10 voluntarily taking the  
4 Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System exam; provided that said report shall be  
5 provided to the secretary of administration and finance, the commissioner of elementary and  
6 secondary education, and the clerks of the senate and house of representatives who shall forward  
7 the same to the chair of the senate ways and means committee, the chair of the house ways and  
8 means committee, and the house and senate chairs of the joint committee on education within 6  
9 months of the effective date of this act.
