The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to academic acceleration of K-12 students.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 1B of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the twenty fifth paragraph, in lines 151-
- 3 167, the following paragraph:-
- 4 "The board of elementary and secondary education shall establish regulations regarding
- 5 the use of whole-grade and content-specific academic acceleration in the public schools of the
- 6 Commonwealth. Said regulations will authorize and provide a framework for school districts to
- 7 provide access to appropriate curriculum and instruction for students who demonstrate readiness
- 8 for academic content, skills or understanding at a level beyond the curriculum ordinarily taught
- 9 to students of a certain age. In developing said regulations, the department shall consider, at a
- minimum, the following acceleration strategies:

11	(a)	Single subject acceleration;	
12	(b)	Combined classes (multi-age);	
13	(c)	Online and correspondence courses;	
14	(d)	Concurrent or dual enrollment;	
15	(e)	Curriculum compacting;	
16	(f)	Credit by examination or prior experience;	
17	(g)	Competency/mastery based learning;	
18	(h)	Whole-grade acceleration (one or more);	
19	(i)	Self-paced instruction;	
20	(j)	Mentoring;	
21	(k)	Early graduation;	
22	Said re	egulations shall require the use of a tool, such as the Iowa Acceleration Scale,	
23	designed to take personal bias out of the decision-making process when considering a child for		
24	acceleration, and to ensure that acceleration decisions are systematic, thoughtful, well-reasoned,		
25	and defensible."
