## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)  
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An Act relative to early-onset Alzheimer's disease.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any General or special law to the contrary, services  
2   provided through the MassHealth Frail Elder Home and Community-Based Services Waiver  
3   shall be made available to persons diagnosed with early-onset Alzheimer's disease regardless of  
4   their age, if they are otherwise eligible for such services. The Secretary for Health and Human  
5   Services shall ensure that the relevant agencies under her purview promulgate regulations as  
6   necessary to implement this act.
