By Representative Ashe of Longmeadow and Senator Lesser, a joint petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 94) of Brian M. Ashe and Eric P. Lesser (by vote of the town) for legislation to revoke the acceptance of a certain General Law establishing a board of election commissioners in the town of Longmeadow. Municipalities and Regional Government. [Local Approval Received.]

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act revoking the town of Longmeadow’s acceptance of a certain general law establishing a board of election commissioners.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding section 4B of chapter 4 of the General Laws relative to the time required
2 for a town’s revocation of its acceptance of a general law, the town of Longmeadow shall be
3 deemed to have revoked its acceptance of section 16A of chapter 51 of the General Laws
4 providing for a 4-member board of election commissioners. On the effective date of this act, the
5 town of Longmeadow shall re-establish a board of registrars which shall consist of the town
6 clerk and 3 other persons who shall be appointed in accordance with section 15 of said chapter
7 51.
