**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**

An Act to study the feasibility of creating and implementing a gypsy moth spraying program.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, there shall be a  
2 special commission, to study and report on the feasibility of creating and implementing a gypsy  
3 moth spraying program. The scope of the commission shall include, but not limited to:  
4 researching, evaluating and developing recommendations related to establishing the policy and  
5 procedures for the control of the spread of the gypsy moth population in the commonwealth;  
6 studying current regulations in Massachusetts and from other states and countries related to the  
7 spraying of pesticides and neonicotinoids; identifying adequacy of funding for efforts to  
8 implement a gypsy moth spraying program; and identifying the economic, environmental and  
9 public health benefits and costs of such program.

10           The special commission shall consist of: the secretary of energy and environmental  
11   affairs, or a designee; the commissioner of environmental protection, or a designee; 3 members  
12   who shall be appointed by the governor-1 member of the senate to be appointed by the senate  
13   president, 1 member of the house of representatives to be appointed by the speaker, 1 member of  
14   the senate appointed by the senate minority leader.

15           The special commission shall submit its final report of the findings and recommendations  
16   together with drafts of legislation to implement those recommendations by filing the same with  
17   the executive office of energy and environmental affairs; the department of environmental  
18   protection; the joint committee on environment, natural resources and agriculture; and the clerks  
19   of the senate and the house no later than 1 year after the passage of this bill.
