**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**

An Act to support educational opportunity for all.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 63 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 38FF the following section:

3 SECTION 38GG. (a) Any private institution of higher learning that has an endowment  
4 fund with aggregate funds in excess of \$1,000,000,000 shall be subject to an annual excise of 2.5  
5 per cent of all monies in aggregate in said endowment fund. For the purposes of this section an  
6 endowment fund shall be an institutional fund, which may consist of multiple funds, of a private  
7 institution of higher learning not wholly expendable by the institution on a current basis under  
8 the terms of the applicable gift instrument. All monies collected from this annual excise shall be

9 deposited in the Educational Opportunity for All Trust Fund established by subsection (b)  
10 of this section.

11 (b) There is hereby established and set up on the books of the commonwealth a separate  
12 fund to be known as the Educational Opportunity for All Trust Fund, hereinafter called the fund.

13 The fund shall be administered by the executive office of education, as directed by the  
14 Educational Opportunity for All Trust Fund Board of Trustees established in subsection (c), and  
15 in consultation with the department of higher education and the department of early education  
16 and care. The fund shall be used exclusively for the purposes of subsidizing the cost of higher  
17 education, early education and child care for lower-income and middle-class residents of the  
18 commonwealth. No expenditure from the fund shall cause the fund to be in deficiency at the  
19 close of a fiscal year.

20 (c) The Educational Opportunity Trust Fund shall be managed by a board to be known as  
21 the Educational Opportunity for All Trust Fund Board of Trustees, hereby established, which  
22 shall have general supervision of the trust and shall direct all expenditures from the fund. The  
23 full duties and obligations of the board shall be set forth in a declaration of trust to be adopted by  
24 the board. The board of trustees shall consist of 7 trustees, including the commissioner of the  
25 department of higher education or a designee, the commissioner of the department of early  
26 education & care or a designee, and 5 additional trustees, 1 of whom shall have demonstrated  
27 expertise in higher education appointed by the President of the Senate, 1 of whom shall have  
28 demonstrated expertise in early education and child care appointed by the Speaker of the House,  
29 1 of whom shall have demonstrated expertise in representing the child care workforce as a leader  
30 in a labor organization appointed by the President of the Senate, 1 of whom shall be an employee  
31 of a Massachusetts community college as defined in section 10 of Chapter 15A appointed by the  
32 Speaker of the House, and 1 of whom shall be an employee of a private institution of higher  
33 learning subject to

34 the annual excise tax established in subsection (a) of this section appointed by the  
35 secretary of education. The appointed trustees shall serve for terms of two years. Trustees shall

36 be eligible for reappointment. The members of the board shall elect 1 of the trustees to serve as  
37 the chair.
