## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act to lift kids out of deep poverty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 118 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
the fourth paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following new paragraph:-

3 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the payment standards for 4 monthly benefits for the program not including the rental allowance shall be increased effective 5 July first of each year beginning with July 1, 2021 by 20 percent above the payment standard in 6 effect in the previous fiscal year until the payment standard for the household size equals 50 7 percent of the federal poverty level for the household size; provided further, that once the 8 payment standard for the household size equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level for the 9 household size, the payment standard shall be increased effective July first of each year in order 10 that the payment standard shall be no less than 50% of the poverty level for the household size as 11 determined by the federal Department of Health and Human Services; provided further, that the 12 need standard and the payment amounts shall be further increased by the amount of a clothing

13	allowance in the month for which it is paid and by the rental allowance for households incurring
14	a rent or mortgage expense and not residing in public or subsidized housing.
15	SECTION 2. Section 1 of chapter 117A of the General Laws is hereby amended by
16	inserting after the first paragraph the following new paragraph:-
17	Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the payment standards for
18	monthly benefits for the program shall be increased effective July first of each year beginning
19	with July 1, 2021 by 20 percent above the payment standard in effect in the previous fiscal year
20	until the payment standard for the household size equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level
21	for the household size; provided further, that once the payment standard for the household size
22	equals 50 percent of the federal poverty level for the household size, the payment standard shall
23	be increased effective July first of each year in order that the payment standard shall be no less
24	than 50% of the poverty level for the household size as determined by the federal Department of
25	Health and Human Services.
