**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to taxpayers in the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 4 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the current number, in line 10, and inserting in
3 place thereof the following number: 5.

4 SECTION 2. Section 46 of Chapter 30 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
5 Official Section, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:- (13) Notwithstanding
6 the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, no employee of the commonwealth
7 shall receive annual compensation from any agency, department, commission, board or other
8 undertaking of the commonwealth in excess of the annual salary paid to the governor exclusive
9 of any additional amounts to which the governor may be entitled pursuant to section 1 of chapter
10 6.

11 SECTION 3. Section 14 of Chapter 75 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
12 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence to the fifth paragraph:-
13 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, no employee of the
14 university shall receive annual compensation in excess of the annual salary paid to the governor
15 exclusive of any additional amounts to which the governor may be entitled pursuant to section 1
16 of chapter 6, unless such excess compensation is paid for using the university's endowment. The
17 university shall maintain detailed accounting records of each instance in which excess
18 compensation is paid for using the university's endowment; provided further that such records
19 shall be considered public records and shall be made readily available for public inspection
20 pursuant to section 10 of chapter 66.
