The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act to promote Massachusetts manufacturers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 30B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new section:-
- 3 Section 24. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary and to the extent
- 4 permitted by federal law, a state agency or governmental body shall procure a minimum of ten
- 5 percent of the contract value of products by businesses, as defined in section 3A of chapter 23A
- of the general laws, provided, that the commonwealth is their principal place of business, and
- 7 provided further, that a waiver process is set forth by the awarding authority.
