**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to Massachusetts Solar Access Law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 3 of Chapter 40A of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting, after the words "or welfare." in line 101, the following:-

3 A damage to the above listed "public health, safety and welfare" shall be proven in the
4 court of law by local authorities that seek to restrict the use of solar systems attached to
5 permanent buildings.
