An Act authorizing the town of Hampden to continue employment of police department member James Gormally.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, James  
2 Gormally, a member of the police department of the town of Hampden, may continue to serve in  
3 such position until the age of 70, the date of his retirement or non-reappointment or the date he is  
4 relieved of his duties by the town, whichever occurs first; provided, however, that he is mentally  
5 and physically capable of performing the duties of his office; and provided further, that the town  
6 may, at its own expense, require that Police Officer Gormally be examined by an impartial  
7 physician designated by the town to determine such capability. No deductions shall be made  
8 from the regular compensation of James Gormally pursuant to chapter 32 of the General Laws  
9 for any service after his reaching the age of 65 in connection with his service to the town for  
10 retirement or pension purposes and, upon retirement, Police Officer Gormally shall receive a

11 superannuation retirement allowance equal to that which he would have been entitled had he  
12 retired at age 65.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
