**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to mandated reporter reform.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 (a) There shall be a special commission to review existing mandated reporter laws
2 and regulations and to report and make recommendations on how to improve the response to, and
3 prevention of, child abuse and neglect. The report shall include, but not be limited to, findings
4 and recommendations on: (i) improving or adding training requirements for employees,
5 including employees of licensees or contracted organizations; and (ii) improving accountability
6 in the mandated reporter system, including procedures for a mandated reporter to notify the
7 person or designated agent in charge and responses to reports of intimidation and retaliation.

8 (b) The commission shall consist of the child advocate, who shall serve as chair
9 and the following persons, or their designees: the secretary of health and human services; the

10 secretary of education; the secretary of public safety and security; the attorney general; the
11 commissioner of elementary and secondary education; the commissioner of early education and
12 care; the commissioner of children and families; the commissioner of the division of professional
13 licensure; the chief counsel of the committee for public counsel services; and a representative of
14 the Massachusetts district attorney association. The commission may consider input from any
15 relevant organization, including but not limited to: the Children’s League of Massachusetts, Inc.,
16 the Massachusetts Children’s Alliance, Inc. and Children’s Trust Massachusetts.

17 (c) The commission shall review: (i) the agencies and employers responsible for
18 training mandated reporters; (ii) the frequency of mandated reporter training and continuing
19 education; (iii) whether agencies and employers follow best practices for mandated reporter
20 training, including profession-specific training for recognizing the signs of child sexual abuse
21 and physical and emotional abuse and neglect; (iv) how agencies notify mandated reporters of
22 changes to the General Laws and regulations; (v) responses by the department of children and
23 families to a written report filed under section 51A of chapter 119 of the General Laws,
24 including a listing of offenses requiring a report be referred to the district attorney; (vi) the

25 feasibility of the development of a confidential internal tracking system for all reports
26 filed under said section 51A of said chapter 119; (vii) whether employer, agency, and employee
27 trainings cover retaliation protections for mandated reporter filing; (viii) whether employer,
28 agency and employee trainings cover fines and penalties for failure to report pursuant to said
29 section 51A of said chapter 119; (ix) protocols related to reports filed under said section 51A of
30 said chapter 119, including procedures for a mandated reporter to notify the person or designated
31 agent in charge and the required documentation; (x) the availability of information at schools
32 regarding the protocols for filing reports under said section 51A of said chapter 119; (xi) options

33 for the development of public service announcements to ensure the safety and well-being of
34 children; (xii) proposals to revise the definition of child abuse and neglect to ensure a standard
35 definition among state agencies that is consistent with appropriate federal authorities; and (xiii)
36 proposals to expand mandated reporting requirements under sections 51A to 51F, inclusive, of
37 said chapter 119.

38 (d) The commission shall file a report of its findings and recommendations, together
39 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry those recommendations into effect, by filing the
40 same with the clerks of the senate and the house of representatives, the chairs of the senate and
41 house committees on ways and means and the chairs of the joint committee on children, families
42 and persons with disabilities not later than July 31, 2020.
