An Act strengthening sexual harassment and discrimination policies in the commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 4 of chapter 151B of the General Laws is hereby amended	1 by
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2 striking out subsection 16A and inserting in place thereof the following:-

3 16A. For an employer, personally or through its agents, to sexually harass any employee; 4 or to retaliate, personally or through its agents, against any employee for filing a complaint of sexual harassment or discrimination based on sex, gender identity or sexual orientation or for 5 6 cooperating in an investigation of a complaint of sexual harassment or discrimination based on 7 sex, gender identity or sexual orientation, including, but not limited to, by termination, 8 suspension, demotion or reduction in the compensation or benefits of the employee; or to require, 9 as a condition of employment, continuing employment, promotion, compensation or the receipt 10 of benefits, entering into an agreement that contains a nondisclosure or confidentiality provision 11 (except as may be necessary to protect business intellectual property and trade secrets), a non-12 disparagement provision, a restriction on reporting sexual harassment or discrimination based on

13 sex, gender identity or sexual orientation or participating in the investigation of a report of sexual 14 harassment or discrimination based on sex, gender identity or sexual orientation, or a waiver of 15 any rights or remedies available under law with respect to claims filed or that may be filed in a 16 civil action or complaints filed or that may be filed in an administrative action for sexual 17 harassment or discrimination based on sex, gender identity or sexual orientation.

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
