**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to the Massachusetts Sentencing Commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 211E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking the fourth sentence of the first paragraph in
3 subsection (a) and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- “Two of the voting
4 members shall be District Attorneys, selected from a list of four District attorneys recommended
5 by the Massachusetts District Attorneys' Association.”

6 SECTION 2. Section 3 of said Chapter 211E, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
7 striking the first paragraph of subsection (a) in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the
8 following:-

9 “(a) (1) The commission, by affirmative vote of at least six members, one of whom shall
10 be a District Attorney or Assistant Attorney General, and consistent with all pertinent provisions
11 of this chapter and existing law, shall recommend sentencing guidelines, which shall take effect

- 12 only if enacted into law. Provided further, in no case shall the Judiciary promulgate, use or rely
- 13 on any sentencing guidelines not approved by the Legislature.”
