### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to the health of correctional employees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-
2	94C. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary
3	affecting the non-contributory or contributory system, any condition of impairment of health
4	caused by Post Traumatic Stress Disorder resulting in total or partial disability or death to an
5	employee of a correctional facility, shall, if he successfully passed a physical examination on
6	entry into such service, or subsequently successfully passed a physical examination, which
7	examination failed to reveal any evidence of such condition, be presumed to have been suffered
8	in the line of duty, unless the contrary be shown by competent evidence.
