An Act relative to maintenance of physical examinations records for public safety personnel.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the following at the end
2	of the first paragraph of Section 94:-

3 If the member's employer failed to maintain a record of the member's physical

4 examination on entry into service, the member or employer may submit an affidavit attesting that

5 the member did undergo such an examination and that the examination failed to reveal evidence

6 of such condition. This affidavit shall constitute satisfactory evidence that the member

7 underwent such a physical.

- 8 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the following sentence at
 9 the end of Section 94A:-
- 10 If the member's employer failed to maintain a record of the member's physical

11 examination on entry into service, the member or employer may submit an affidavit attesting that
