The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to a COVID-19 presumption for public employees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any employee
- 2 of the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions who was required to work during the
- 3 Massachusetts state of emergency related to COVID-19 declared on March 11, and required to
- 4 report to a work location outside of their home, who contract, have symptoms of or otherwise
- 5 becomes affected with the Coronavirus (COVID-19), that results in a period of hospitalization,
- 6 quarantine, or require self-quarantined measures as a result of being infected or coming into
- 7 contact with someone who is infected with this virus, shall have their medical condition or
- 8 incapacity to work presumed to be work-related.
- 9 SECTION 2. Any employee of the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions who was
- 10 required to work during the Massachusetts state of emergency related to COVID-19 declared on

- 11 March 11, and required to report to a work location outside of their home and who dies as a
- result of work-related COVID-19 shall be eligible for benefits under section 100 and 100A of
- 13 Chapter 32 of the General Laws.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.
