An Act to establish the third Saturday in July as Negro Election Day.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section  
2 15IIIIII the following section:-

3           Section 15JJJJJ. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the third  
4 Saturday in July as Negro Election Day in commemoration of the adoption of the first black  
5 voting system of 1740 and recommend that the day be observed in an appropriate manner by the  
6 people.
