In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act to update the Massachusetts rideshare program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. The department of environmental protection shall revise the regulations
- 2 governing the rideshare program, 310 CMR 7.16, to achieve the following:-
- 3 (1) significantly expand the rideshare program by redefining affected facilities to include
- 4 more employers with less than 1000 employees;
- 5 (2) provide exemptions for employers who are members of transportation management
- 6 associations;
- 7 (3) require transportation management associations to submit reports for affected
- 8 facilities that are members of the associations;

- 9 (4) permit transportation management associations to submit consolidated reports for
 10 employers within their geographic service area;
- (5) permit employers and transportation management associations with drive-alone rates
 under 75% to submit required reports every two years;
- 13 SECTION 2. The Department of Environmental Protection shall consolidate reports on
- 14 the ridesharing program and release to the public, at a minimum, the following information:
- 15 (1) the statewide drive-alone rate
- 16 (2) the percentage of affected facilities that have drive-alone rates below 75%
- SECTION 3. The department shall issue the revised regulations no later than 180 days
 after the effective date of this act.
