**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to unpaved roads.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Massachusetts Department of Transportation, in conjunction with the
2 Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs, shall convene a working group to
3 identify and evaluate the safe, efficient and environmentally sound maintenance and
4 improvement of unpaved (dirt and gravel) roads and paved low volume roads (LVR) in the
5 Commonwealth.

6 The working group shall, at a minimum: develop a database of both unpaved roads and
7 paved LVRs; analyze the unpaved road miles and paved LVR miles per municipality and county
8 in relation to other road miles in the same municipality and county; collect data on the annual
9 maintenance and improvement costs for unpaved roads and paved LVR over the previous five
10 years for each municipality located in a county whose unpaved road miles total over 20% of total
11 county roadway mileage; examine the potential relationship between climate change and
12 maintenance and improvement costs for unpaved roads and paved LVRs; identify existing
13 funding streams in Massachusetts available to municipalities to maintain and improve unpaved

14 roads and paved LVRs; identify potential funding gaps to support the safe, efficient and
15 environmentally sound maintenance and improvement of unpaved and paved LVRs in the
16 Commonwealth; compile and review existing studies and reports on unpaved roads and paved
17 LVRs in the Commonwealth; determine the feasibility of developing a condition rating system
18 for unpaved roads and paved LVRs; determine the feasibility of developing statewide standards
19 for unpaved roads; research national best practices on the safe, efficient and environmentally
20 sound maintenance and improvement for unpaved roads and paved LVRs including existing
21 state-funded maintenance programs.

22 The working group shall include, but shall not be limited to: the secretary of
23 transportation or a designee, who shall serve as co-chair; the secretary of energy and
24 environmental affairs or a designee, who shall serve as co-chair; the commissioner of revenue or
25 a designee; the secretary of public safety and security or a designee; a designee of the rural
26 policy advisory commission; two designees of the Massachusetts Highway Association; a
27 designee of the Massachusetts Municipal Association, Inc.; a transportation planner from a MA
28 Transportation Planning Organization; a designee of the University of Massachusetts Amherst
29 Transportation Center; and a designee of the Massachusetts Association of Conservation
30 Commissions, Inc. The working group shall hold its first meeting not later than January 1, 2022.

31 The working group shall submit its findings to the clerks of the house of representatives
32 and the senate, the chairs of the house and senate committees on ways and means, the chairs of
33 the joint committee on environment, natural resources and agriculture and the chairs of the joint
34 committee on transportation not later than June 30, 2022.
