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An Act relative to the disclosure of smoking within a multi-residence building by lessor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 186 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by inserting the following new section after section 21:-

3 Section 21A. Disclosure of smoking or vaping within a multi-residence building by
4 lessor; violations

5 Section 21A. The landlord of any residential property shall disclose prominently in the
6 lease or rental agreement whether smoking or vaping or any combination of the two is permitted
7 in the residence or any part of the building or premises where the residence is located. If the
8 landlord violates this section, the tenant shall be entitled to terminate the lease or rental
9 agreement consistent with all other provisions relating to the termination of the lease or rental
10 agreement.
