Senate, May 5, 2022 -- Text of the Senate amendment to the House Bill relative to work and family mobility (House, No. 4470) (being the text of Senate, No. 2851, printed as amended)

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 275 to 277, inclusive, the words "No 3 license of any type may be issued to any person who does not have lawful presence in the United 4 States" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- An applicant for a license under this 5 section who does not provide proof of lawful presence, including an applicant who is ineligible 6 for a social security number, shall be eligible for a Massachusetts license to operate a motor 7 vehicle if the applicant meets all other qualifications for licensure and provides satisfactory proof 8 to the registrar of their identity, date of birth and Massachusetts residency. When processing an 9 application for a Massachusetts license pursuant to this section or a learner's permit pursuant to 10 Section 8B, the registrar shall not inquire about or create a record of an applicant's citizenship or 11 immigration status except as required under title 52 of the United States Code or chapter 51 of 12 the General Laws. When processing an application for registration of a motor vehicle, or a 13 renewal thereof, submitted by an applicant who holds a Massachusetts license, the registrar shall 14 not inquire about or create a record of an applicant's citizenship or immigration status.

SECTION 2. Said section 8 of said chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby further
amended by striking out, in lines 278 to 279, inclusive, the words "or a Massachusetts license".

17	SECTION 3. Said section 8 of said chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby further
18	amended by inserting after the word "a", in line 287, the following words:- REAL ID-compliant.
19	SECTION 4. Said section 8 of said chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby further
20	amended by inserting after the word "temporary.", in line 295, the following words:- If, at the
21	expiration of the term of a REAL ID-compliant license, the licensee does not provide proof of
22	lawful presence, the licensee shall remain eligible to apply for a Massachusetts license.
23	SECTION 5. Said section 8 of said chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby further
24	amended by adding the following 3 paragraphs:-
25	If an applicant for a license under this section or a learner's permit under section 8B does
26	not provide proof of lawful presence, the applicant shall submit to the registrar, and the registrar
27	shall accept as proof of their identity and date of birth, 2 documents: (i)(A) a valid unexpired
28	foreign passport; or (B) a valid unexpired consular identification document; and (ii)(A) a valid
29	unexpired driver's license from any state or territory of the United States; (B) an original or
30	certified copy of a birth certificate; (C) a valid unexpired foreign national identification card; (D)
31	a valid unexpired foreign driver's license; or (E) a marriage certificate or divorce decree issued
32	by any state or territory of the United States. One document submitted as proof of an applicant's
33	identity pursuant to this paragraph shall include a photograph and 1 document submitted as proof
34	of an applicant's identity pursuant to this paragraph shall include a date of birth. Any document
35	submitted as proof of an applicant's identity pursuant to this paragraph that is in a language other
36	than English shall be accompanied by a certified translation of the document into English.
37	In addition to the powers and authority conferred upon the registrar pursuant to section 10
38	with respect to standards of fitness for operation of a motor vehicle, the registrar may conduct a

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39 review of any document issued by another country that is submitted by an applicant for a license 40 under this section or a learner's permit under section 8B who does not provide proof of lawful 41 presence, including an applicant who is ineligible for a social security number, to determine 42 whether reasonable cause exists to exclude the document as proof of identity or date of birth. 43 Each applicant for a license under this section or a learner's permit under section 8B shall

44 attest, under the pains and penalties of perjury, that their license or right to operate has not been45 suspended or revoked in another state, country or jurisdiction.

SECTION 6. Section 8B of said chapter 90, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
striking out, in lines 42 to 44, inclusive, the words ", except that no permit shall be issued to an
applicant for a period of time longer than the registrar determines the applicant is legally
authorized to remain in the United States".

50 SECTION 7. (a) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any 51 information provided by or relating to an applicant for a Massachusetts license under section 8 of 52 chapter 90 of the General Laws or a learner's permit under section 8B of said chapter 90, 53 including failure to provide proof of lawful presence as defined in section 1 of said chapter 90, 54 including, but not limited to, personally identifying information and communications between 55 the applicant and the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to said section 8 or said section 8B of 56 said chapter 90, shall neither be a public record nor disclosed by the registrar, except as required 57 by federal law or as authorized by regulations promulgated by the attorney general; provided, 58 however, that information maintained by the motor vehicle insurance merit rating board pursuant 59 to section 57A of chapter 6C of the General Laws may be disseminated for motor vehicle 60 insurance purposes; and provided further, that any information disseminated for motor vehicle

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61 insurance purposes shall remain confidential and be used solely for the purpose of motor vehicle62 insurance.

63 (b) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any information provided by or relating to the holder of a Massachusetts license issued under said section 8 of said chapter 64 65 90 or a learner's permit issued under said section 8B of said chapter 90, including failure to 66 provide proof of lawful presence as defined in said section 1 of said chapter 90, including, but 67 not limited to, personally identifying information and communications between the holder and 68 the registrar of motor vehicles pursuant to said section 8 or said section 8B of said chapter 90, 69 shall neither be a public record nor disclosed by the registrar, except as required by federal law 70 or as authorized by regulations promulgated by the attorney general; provided, however, that 71 information maintained by the motor vehicle insurance merit rating board pursuant to said 72 section 57A of said chapter 6C may be disseminated for motor vehicle insurance purposes; and 73 provided further, that any information disseminated for motor vehicle insurance purposes shall 74 remain confidential and be used solely for the purpose of motor vehicle insurance.

SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the registrar of motor vehicles shall promulgate rules and regulations regarding proof of identity, date of birth and Massachusetts residency applicable to United States citizens and other persons who provide proof of lawful presence as defined in section 1 of chapter 90 of the General Laws who elect to apply for a Massachusetts license pursuant to section 8 of said chapter 90.

80 SECTION 9. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the registrar of 81 motor vehicles, in consultation with the state secretary, shall establish procedures and may 82 promulgate regulations to ensure that an applicant for a Massachusetts license pursuant to section

83	8 of chapter 90 of the General Laws or a learner's permit pursuant to section 8B of said chapter
84	90 who does not provide proof of lawful presence as defined in section 1 of chapter 90 of the
85	General Laws shall not be automatically registered to vote pursuant to the National Voter
86	Registration Act of 1993, 52 U.S.C. chapter 205, or any general or special law.

87 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
