**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to changing the term board of selectmen to Select Board in the town of Wilmington.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 592 of the acts of 1950 as amended by chapter 52 of the acts of the  
2 2004 is hereby amended by replacing the term “Board of Selectmen”, “Board of Selectman”,  
3 “Board” or “Selectmen appearing in any context where reference is made to the entire Board,  
4 with the term “Select Board”.

5           SECTION 2. Said chapter 592 of the acts of 1950 as amended by chapter 52 of the acts of  
6 the 2004 is hereby amended by replacing any reference to individual members of the Board with,  
7 “Select Board member”.

8           SECTION 3. Said chapter 592 of the acts of 1950 as amended by chapter 52 of the acts  
9 of the 2004 is hereby amended by replacing any reference to a “Chairman” with the “Chair”.
