By Mr. Crighton, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 304) of Brendan P. Crighton and James B. Eldridge for legislation to promote racially and culturally inclusive K-12 curriculum. Education.

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act promoting racially and culturally inclusive K-12 curriculum.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1E of chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended in line 1 by inserting after "Section 1E." the following:-
- 3 (a) Said section is further amended in lines 30-36, inclusive, by striking out the paragraph
- 4 contained in those lines and inserting in place thereof the following subsections:
- 5 (b) Frameworks shall be designed to avoid perpetuating gender, cultural, ethnic, or racial
- 6 stereotypes. Frameworks for all academic subjects shall be designed to build racially and
- 7 culturally responsive knowledge and to combat racial and cultural bias. Frameworks shall elevate
- 8 the history, achievements, and key writings of members of communities of color and other
- 9 marginalized communities. The frameworks shall reflect sensitivity to different learning styles
- and impediments to learning. The board shall develop procedures for updating, improving, or
- refining said curriculum frameworks; and shall have a meaningful process for soliciting and
- incorporating input from stakeholders, including but not limited to educators, students, and

- members of communities of color and other marginalized communities, in the development of frameworks. A copy of said frameworks shall be submitted to the joint committee on education at least sixty days prior to taking effect.
- 16 (c) The department shall promulgate regulations setting forth a complaint procedure to
 17 enforce subsection (b). A final determination of a complaint by the department shall be
 18 appealable to the Massachusetts Superior Court.
