An Act relative to creating a loan repayment program for human service workers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 6A of the general laws, as so appearing in the 2018 official edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after section 16Z the following new section:-

3 Section 16AA. (a) As used in this section, the following words shall, unless the context  
4 clearly requires otherwise, have the following meanings:

5 “qualified education loan,” any indebtedness, including interest on such indebtedness,  
6 incurred to pay tuition or other direct expenses incurred in the connection with the pursuit of a  
7 certificate, undergraduate or graduate degree by an applicant. It shall not include loans made by  
8 any person related to the applicant.

9           “human service provider,” a community-based human services organization with a  
10 human services program funded by the executive office of health and human services, the  
11 executive office of elder affairs, the department of housing and community development or the  
12 department of early education and care.

13           “human services worker,” an employee of a human service provider who provides  
14 treatment, support, or services to clients or their families.

15           (b) There shall be a student loan repayment program for human service workers to  
16 encourage individuals to enter the field and maintain employment at human service programs.  
17 The Executive Office of Health and Human Services shall administer the program in accordance  
18 with guidelines promulgated by the Department of Higher Education.

19           (c) To be eligible for this program, a participant must be working a minimum of 35 hours  
20 per week as a human service worker and have an individual income of no more than \$50,000 per  
21 year. Further, individuals must have maintained 12 consecutive months of employment as a  
22 human service worker at a minimum of 35 hours per week to be eligible for this program. This  
23 program will help defray costs from previously incurred student loans for graduates holding  
24 certificate, undergraduate or graduate degrees.

25           Eligible participants in this program can be reimbursed up to \$1,800 per year based on  
26 the amount of loan payments made by the participant. The Commonwealth shall repay the  
27 eligible participant’s student loan at a rate not to exceed \$150 per month for a period not to  
28 exceed 48 months. Payments by the Commonwealth shall cover loan payments by the eligible  
29 participant only during the months in which the human service workers provides services in the  
30 Commonwealth, and the payments shall be made directly to the lender.
