Reentry Program:

Staff returned to work June 15, 2021. The four-month Reentry Program is not running in a specific housing unit. However, the Reentry Advocates are conducting intakes, LSCMI's, exit interviews and setting up post-release continuum of care services and program placements. They completed 32 LSCMI/intakes, 11 exit interviews, and 8 long-term residential or sober house placements. Safe housing concerns, that at times result in a change of unit demographics, along with the low number of sentenced inmates continues to create challenges for unit specific program housing.

Violence Prevention Unit (S.A.V.E/Sheriff's Anti-Violence Effort):

The four-month Violence Prevention Program has not been in a specific housing unit since November 2020 when staff were sent home due to the pandemic. Staff returned to work on June 15, 2021. In September 2021 we were given approval to start the Pathways to Recovery Program which provides SUD and other related services to our pre-trial population housed in Unit FS-1. Pathways to Recovery shut down on December 6, 2021 when staff were instructed not to return to work due to the pandemic. Safe housing concerns, unit demographic changes, and the low number of sentenced inmates have created challenges for our program staff but they put their services where they can be of use.
