**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act to promote graduate medical education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 118E of the General Laws is amended by adding at the end thereof,
2 the following new section:

3 Section 78. MassHealth shall make Graduate Medical Education payments for primary
4 care, behavioral health, and other physician shortage professions residency training. Eligible
5 recipients shall include community health centers and hospitals licensed in the Commonwealth.
