In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act providing immediate childcare assistance to homeless families.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 15D of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

3	Section 19. (a) A family placed in temporary emergency assistance shelter and receiving
4	TAFDC assistance from the department of transitional assistance shall be eligible for the
5	department of early education and care's homeless child care assistance vouchers when the
6	family first arrives at the shelter and at any time the family chooses while residing in the shelter
7	regardless of whether they meet work requirements as determined by the department of
8	transitional assistance.

9 (b) A family who meets the McKinney-Vento Homelessness Assistance Act definition of 10 homeless and is receiving TAFDC assistance from the department of transitional assistance shall 11 be eligible for the department of early education and care's homeless child care assistance 12 vouchers. {regardless of whether they meet work requirements as determined by the Department 13 of Transitional Assistance}

(c) A letter verifying shelter residency will qualify a family receiving TAFDC assistance
for a full-time childcare referral from the department of transitional assistance.

16 (d) Upon (i) a family's entry to a temporary emergency assistance shelter, domestic 17 violence shelter, substance abuse and recovery shelter or non-emergency assistance shelter, or 18 (ii) upon family's receipt of a letter from EEC or its designees verifying that a family meets the 19 McKinney-Vento Homelessness Assistance Act definition of homeless, any of the family's 20 children ages zero to three years shall be considered as qualifying for early intervention services 21 according to DPH operational standards. This qualification shall ensure eligibility for services 22 regardless of the presence or absence of other relevant risk factors, and qualification shall begin 23 from the date of their entry into shelter or receipt of McKinney-Vento verification letter and 24 continue for one year after their exit from shelter or receipt of McKinney-Vento verification 25 letter.

SECTION 2. The department shall adopt regulations or policies and remove procedural
 barriers for the administration of this act within 90 days of the effective date of this act.
