An Act to respect and protect domestic violence and sexual assault victims and survivors.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 97D, of Chapter 41, as so appearing in the 2020 General Laws, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting the following after "performance of their duties" in line 14:-

3           and (iii) police departments, district attorneys and other legal bodies shall respond to  
4 public request for statistical data on reports of domestic violence, rape and sexual assault or  
5 attempts to commit such offenses as well as for reports of abuse perpetrated by family or  
6 household members, as defined in section 1 of chapter 209A, with personal information redacted  
7 in accordance with Section 10 of Chapter 66;
