## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act decriminalizing fentanyl test strips.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 94C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 2 Official Edition, is amended in section 32I, in line 25, by inserting after the words "section 27"
- 3 the following: ", or testing products utilized in determining whether a controlled substance
- 4 contains chemicals, toxic substances or hazardous compounds in quantities which can cause
- 5 physical harm or death. The term "testing products" shall include, but is not limited to, fentanyl
- 6 test strips."
