The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act providing educational stability for vulnerable children.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 18B of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
section 9 the following two sections:-

3 Section 9A. The commissioner shall appoint an education director to support the

4 department's goal of educational stability and success for all elementary and secondary school

5 students under the care and custody of the department.

6 The education director's duties shall include, but not be limited to: (i) development, 7 implementation, and oversight of the department's policies on education for children under the 8 care and custody of the department, including policy development and practice guidance; (ii) 9 monitor state and federal laws, programs, and resources that may impact the education of 10 children under the care and custody of the department; (iii) advise the commissioner and all 11 education coordinators on all matters relating to education, strategic education initiatives, policy, 12 and practice management matters; (iv) coordinate efforts with area office based education coordinators to identify systemic barriers to accessing educational services for children under the care and custody of the department, including issues related to transportation for children in department care or custody to attend their school of origin; (v) coordinate with department area and regional offices on education related issues; and (vi) facilitate best practice training for area office based education coordinators.

18 The education director shall perform such duties as are described in this chapter and such 19 other duties as may be assigned by the commissioner.

Section 9B. The commissioner, with the advice of the education director and the area director, shall appoint at least one full-time education specialist at each area office. Said education specialist shall be an employee of the area office and devote full time to the duties of the office.

24 The focus of each education specialist's duties shall include, but not be limited to: (i) 25 implementation and oversight of the area office's work on education for children receiving 26 services from the department, consistent with the policies created by the department's education 27 manager; (ii) monitor student academic progress of children under the care and custody of the 28 area office not less than once per academic quarter; (iii) provide support and assistance to 29 department caseworkers regarding educational needs of children; (iv) provide detailed training to 30 department caseworkers on the best practices to monitor a child's education experiences, 31 recognize unavailability of resources preventing a child from participating in school courses, and 32 develop individual education plans or 504 plan; (v) ensure the timeliness and accuracy of the 33 transfer of education records detailing a child's educational background and needs; and (vi)

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- 34 maintain contact with appropriate local school districts and education organizations to facilitate
- 35 enrollment and placement of children into school districts served by the area office.
