The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act providing opportunities for apprentices to complete their training and for ensuring a skilled workforce in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 26 of Chapter 149 is hereby amended by adding at the end:

2 For projects over one million dollars, the total hours of employees, by trade, receiving an

3 hourly wage who are directly employed on the site of the project, employed by the contractor or

4 a subcontractor and subject to the prevailing wage, shall be performed by apprentices in bona

5 fide apprentice training programs as provided in sections 11H and 11I of chapter 23 of the

6 General Laws which are approved by the division of apprentice training in the executive office

7 of labor and workforce development and in compliance with apprentice ratios established by any

8 trades license board.

9 Six months after the passage of this act, 5% of the hours shall be performed by
10 apprentices.

One year after the passage of this act, 10% of the hours shall be performed byapprentices.

13 Two years after the passage of this act, 15% of the hours shall be performed by14 apprentices.

15 Section 6 of Chapter 149 A shall be amended by adding a new section:

(f) For projects over one million dollars, the total hours of employees, by trade, receiving an hourly wage who are directly employed on the site of the project, employed by the contractor or a subcontractor and subject to the prevailing wage, shall be performed by apprentices in bona fide apprentice training programs as provided in sections 11H and 11I of chapter 23 of the General Laws which are approved by the division of apprentice training in the executive office of labor and workforce development and in compliance with apprentice ratios established by any trades license board.

23 Six months after the passage of this act 5% of the hours shall be performed by24 apprentices.

One year after the passage of this act, 10% of the hours shall be performed byapprentices.

27 Two years after the passage of this act, 15% of the hours shall be performed by28 apprentices.

29 Chapter 30 Section 39m is hereby amended by adding a new section:

30 (f) For projects over one million dollars, the total hours of employees, by trade, receiving
31 an hourly wage who are directly employed on the site of the project, employed by the contractor

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32	or a subcontractor and subject to the prevailing wage, shall be performed by apprentices in bona
33	fide apprentice training programs as provided in sections 11H and 11I of chapter 23 of the
34	General Laws which are approved by the division of apprentice training in the executive office
35	of labor and workforce development and in compliance with apprentice ratios established by any
36	trades license board.
37	Six months after the passage of this act, 5% of the hours shall be performed by
38	apprentices.
39	One year after the passage of this act, 10% of the hours shall be performed by
40	apprentices.
41	Two years after the passage of this act, 15% of the hours shall be performed by
42	apprentices.
