In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to PFML for bone marrow and organ donation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 175M of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
2	Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting the following definitions:-
3	"Blood donor," an individual who donates whole blood or blood derivatives at any blood
4	collection site or hospital in the commonwealth.
5	"Bone marrow transplant donor," an individual from whose body bone marrow is taken
6	to be transferred to the body of another person.
7	"Living organ donor," an individual who donates all or part of an organ and is not
8	deceased.
9	SECTION 2. Said section 1 of said chapter 175M, as so appearing, is hereby further
10	amended by striking out, in line 147, the words "paragraph (2)" and inserting in place thereof the
11	following words:- paragraphs (2) and (3)

12	SECTION 3. Subsection (a) of section 2 of said chapter 175M, as so appearing, is hereby
13	amended by inserting after paragraph (2) the following paragraph:-
14	(3) Medical leave shall be available to any covered individual serving as a living organ
15	donor, bone marrow transplant donor, or blood donor. Such leave shall cover any procedures,
16	medical tests, and surgeries related to donation, including recovery from said donation.
17	SECTION 4. Subsection (c)(1) of said section 2 of said chapter 175M, as so appearing, is
18	hereby amended by inserting after the word "weeks", in line 29, the following words:-
19	, including no more than 30 days to serve as a living organ donor, no more than 5 days to
20	serve as a bone marrow transplant donor, and no more than 4 hours, at a maximum of 5 times per
21	benefit year, to serve as a blood donor,
22	SECTION 5. Subsection (c)(2) of said section 2 of said chapter 175M, as so appearing, is
23	hereby amended by striking out, in line 41, the words "paragraph (2)" and inserting in place
24	thereof the following words:- paragraphs (2) and (3)
25	SECTION 6. Said subsection (c)(2) of said section 2 of said chapter 175M, as so
26	appearing, is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 46, the words "or (2)" and inserting
27	in place thereof the following words:-, (2) or (3)
28	SECTION 7. Subsection (a) of section 3 of said chapter 175M, as so appearing, is hereby
29	amended by inserting after the first sentence the following sentence:-
30	For medical leave taken pursuant to paragraph (3) of subsection (a) of section 2 of this
31	chapter, the 7-calendar day waiting period for medical leave shall not be required.

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32 SECTION 8. Subsection (a) of section 5 of said chapter 175M, as so appearing, is hereby
 33 amended by inserting after paragraph (7) the following paragraph:-

34 (8) Certification for a covered individual taking medical leave pursuant to paragraph (3)
35 of subsection (a) of section 2 of this chapter shall be sufficient if it states the date and time at
36 which the donation occurred or will occur, the place at which the donation occurred or will
37 occur, the probable duration of the donation procedure and recovery within the knowledge of the
38 health care provider as required by the department, and, if applicable, a statement of the medical
39 necessity, if any, for intermittent leave or leave on a reduced leave schedule and the expected
40 duration of the intermittent leave or reduced leave schedule.
