The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act creating a special legislative commission to study barriers to job retention for lowincome workers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1.

2 a) Notwithstanding any special or general law to the contrary, there shall be a special

3 commission established to conduct a study and make recommendations on the barriers faced by

4 low-income workers to finding and maintaining jobs in the Commonwealth. The commission

5 shall consist of 18 members, as follows:

6 i. House and Senate Chairs of the Committee on Labor and Workforce

7 Development, who shall serve as Co-Chairs;

8	ii.	the Secretary of Labor and Workforce Development or the Secretary's designee;
9	iii.	the Secretary of Transportation or the Secretary's designee;
10	iv.	the Secretary of Housing and Economic Development or the Secretary's designee;
11	v.	the Secretary of the Department of Transitional Assistance or the Secretary's
12 designee;		
13	vi.	the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services or the Secretary's
14	designee;	
15	vii.	1 of whom shall be a member of the House of Representatives to be appointed by
16 the Speaker of the House;		
17	viii.	1 of whom shall be member of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate President;
18	ix.	1 of whom shall be appointed by Ascentria Care Alliance
19	х.	1 of whom shall be appointed by the Job Training Alliance
20	xi.	1 of whom shall be appointed by the Massachusetts Retail Association
21	xii.	1 of whom shall be appointed by Associated Industry of Massachusetts

- b) The Commission shall examine and make recommendations on topics including,
 but not limited to:
- i. Barriers that exist in Massachusetts that prevent low-income workers from finding
 and retaining jobs with sustainable wages;
- 31 ii. Strategies that the Commonwealth could employ that would help to address
 32 barriers to job retention for low-income workers;

iii. Massachusetts laws and regulations that are currently in place, or could be put in
 place, that assist or hamper this population from maintaining jobs with a sustainable wage;

iv. Holistic and wraparound service approaches and programs that the
 Commonwealth could explore to prevent a fragmented and inefficient response to addressing
 these barriers.

38 c) The commission may hold hearings and invite testimony from experts and the
39 public to gather information. The Commission and its working groups are encouraged to involve
40 other experts, stakeholders and members of the public in its work through listening and working
41 group sessions or whatever other mechanisms the Commission chooses.

d) The commission shall file its recommendations, including any drafts of legislation
or regulations necessary to carry out its recommendations, with the clerks of the house of
representatives and senate, the joint committee on public health and the joint committee on
health care financing not later than March 1, 2024.
