**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**

An Act relative to the limited sharing of medical information with the family of mentally ill patients in emergency situations.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 70E of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 20202  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following new paragraph:-

3           Notwithstanding anything in this section to the contrary, the physician or other person  
4 responsible for the care of a patient suffering from severe mental illness shall be permitted to  
5 disclose certain information concerning such patient's medical condition to members of the  
6 patient's immediate family in an emergency, without the patient's prior consent; provided, that  
7 the scope and duration of such information sharing shall be limited to the extent deemed  
8 necessary by said physician or caregiver to prevent the patient from sustaining serious bodily  
9 injury, a life-threatening medical condition, or death.
