Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 16 of chapter 44B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 4, the words "in the same manner
- 3 and".
- 4 SECTION 2. Said section 16 of said chapter 44B, as so appearing, is hereby further
- 5 amended by striking out, in lines 10 and 11, the words "in the same manner as they were
- 6 accepted by such city or town" and inserting in place thereof the following words:- by
- 7 acceptance of the voters of such city or town at the next regular municipal or state election.
- 8 SECTION 3. Subsection (b) of said section 16 of said chapter 44B is hereby amended by
- 9 adding the following sentence:- At least once every 10 years, beginning 10 years after the date
- on which sections 3 to 7, inclusive, have been accepted in a city or town, a question seeking
- revocation of such city or town's acceptance of sections 3 to 7, inclusive, shall be presented for

- 12 acceptance of the voters of such city or town at the next regular municipal or state election
- within such 10 years.
