## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act regulating central service technicians.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

#### 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as appearing in the 2018

2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after section 234 the following section:-

3 Section 235.

4 (a) For purposes of this section, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- 5 "Central Service Technician," any person, who decontaminates, inspects, assembles,
- 6 packages, and sterilizes reusable medical instruments or devices being used by a health care

7 facility.

8	"Health care practitioner," any person licensed or registered under chapter 111 or 112,
9	including any intern, resident, fellow or medical officer who conducts or assists with the
10	performance of surgery.
11	"Health care facility," shall mean any "hospital" as defined in section 52 of chapter 111
12	or any "rural hospital" as defined in section 52 of chapter 111 or surgical services that are
13	provided by a free-standing ambulatory surgery center, whether inpatient or outpatient,
14	conducted for charity or for profit and whether or not subject to section 25C. "Health care
15	facility" shall not include dental or private office of a health care practitioner.
16	(b) A health care facility shall not employ or otherwise retain the services of a central
17	service technician unless such person:
18	(1) Has successfully passed a nationally accredited central service exam for central
19	service technicians, and holds and maintains one of the following credentials administered by a

20	nationally accredited central service technician credentialing organization: the certified

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28	(d) A person who qualifies to function as a central service technician in a health care
29	facility under paragraphs (b)(1) and (2) of this section must annually complete 10 hours of
30	continuing education credits to remain qualified to function as a central service technician. The
31	continuing education required under this subsection shall be in the area related to the functions of
32	a central service technician.
33 34	(e) Nothing in this section shall prohibit the following persons from performing the tasks or functions of a central service technicians:
35	(1) A health care practitioner;
36	(2) A student or intern performing the functions of a central service technician under the
37	direct supervision of a health care practitioner as part of the student's or intern's training or
38	internship; or
39	(3) A person who holds or maintains a registration, certification, or license by a
40	nationally accredited credentialing organization to perform health services.
41	(f) A health care facility shall, upon the written request of a central service technician,
42	verify, in writing, the central service technician's dates of employment or the contract period
43	during which the central service technician provided services to the health care facility.
44	SECTION 2. The commissioner of the department of public health may adopt regulations
45	necessary to carry out this act. Such regulations shall be adopted not later than 90 days after the
46	effective date of this act.
47	SECTION 3. Section 1 shall take effect 180 days after the effective date of this act.

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
