## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to motor vehicle battery storage.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 59A the
- 2 following section:-
- 3 Section 59B. All holders of a Class 1, Class 2 or Class 3 license pursuant to section 58,
- 4 all owners or operators of a motor vehicle repair shop registered pursuant to chapter 100A, all
- 5 owners or operators of a junkyard or automobile graveyard as those terms are defined in section
- 6 1 of chapter 140B or any person or entity who sells or stores motor vehicle batteries shall
- 7 prominently display notice to the public and first responders of the presence of motor vehicle
- 8 batteries on the premises. Violation of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of \$250.
