## In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court

(2023-2024)

An Act regarding the phasedown of HFCs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 143 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 100 the following section:-

Section 101. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary; No provision of the Massachusetts building code, or any other law, regulation, or other requirement in Massachusetts, may prohibit or otherwise limit the use of a refrigerant designated as acceptable for use pursuant to and in accordance with 42 U.S.C. 7671 k , provided any equipment containing such refrigerant is listed and installed in accordance with safety standards and use conditions imposed pursuant to such designation.
