The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act exempting all positions in the police department of the town of Montague from the civil service law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, all positions in
2	the police department of the town of Montague shall be exempt from chapter 31 of the General
3	Laws.
4	SECTION 2. This act shall not impair the civil service status of a person holding a
5	position described in section 1 on the effective date of this act.
6	SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 2, no appointments or
7	promotions made after the effective date of this act will be governed in any way by chapter 31 of
8	the General Laws.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage. 9
