**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act relative to civil service resident preference.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 58 of Chapter 31 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end of the third paragraph, the following
3 new sentence:-

4 By a vote of the legislative body, a city or town shall consider an applicant as having
5 resided in that city or town for one year immediately prior to the date of the examination, if the
6 applicant so chooses if they have obtained a high school diploma from a school in that city or
7 town or resided in that city or town when they received their high school diploma.
