## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act to enhance child care relief.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 62 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after

2 section 65 the following section:-

3 Section 66. CHILD CARE RELIEF

4	(i) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, grants and payments, as
5	described in (i) Title VIII of the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act,
6	P.L. 116-136, (ii) Title III of Division H of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021, P.L.
7	116-260, (iii) Sec. 2202 of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, P.L. 117-2, and (iv)
8	Line Item 3000-3060 of Section 2 of Chapter 24 of the Act of 2021 and distributed to child care
9	providers for the purpose of supporting the stability of the child care sector as related to the
10	COVID-19 pandemic, shall be deducted from gross income for the purpose of determining gross
11	income under sections 2, 17, and 17A of chapter 62 of the General Laws.

- 12 (ii) For the purpose of this section, grants and payments exempted from gross income as
- 13 described in subsection (i) do not include payments for parent fees covered by the
- 14 commonwealth.
- 15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
