In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act further regulating junior operator licenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
- 2 section 13D the following section:-
- 3 13D1/2. High schools shall annually provide a seminar on the dangers of texting and

4 driving. All students shall be required to attend the seminar.

- 5 SECTION 2. The second paragraph of section 8 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is
- 6 hereby amended by adding the following clause:-
- 7 (f) submitted a letter of good standing for the applicant by his or her principal or
- 8 designated school official.

- 9 SECTION 3. Section 8M of said chapter 90 is hereby amended by striking out the
 10 second paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-
- A junior operator who violates the preceding paragraph shall be punished by a fine of \$100 and shall have his or her license or permit suspended for up to 180 days for a first offense and shall not be eligible for license reinstatement until he or she also completes a program selected by the registrar that encourages attitudinal changes in young drivers; for a second offense by a fine of \$250 and shall have his or her license or permit suspended for up to 1 year; and for a third or subsequent offense by a fine of \$500 and shall have his or her license or permit suspended for 1 year.
- 18 SECTION 4. Section 17 of said chapter 90 is hereby amended by adding the following19 paragraph:
- A junior operator who violates this section may be subject to a 180-day license
 suspension and a minimum fine of \$100 for their first offense.
